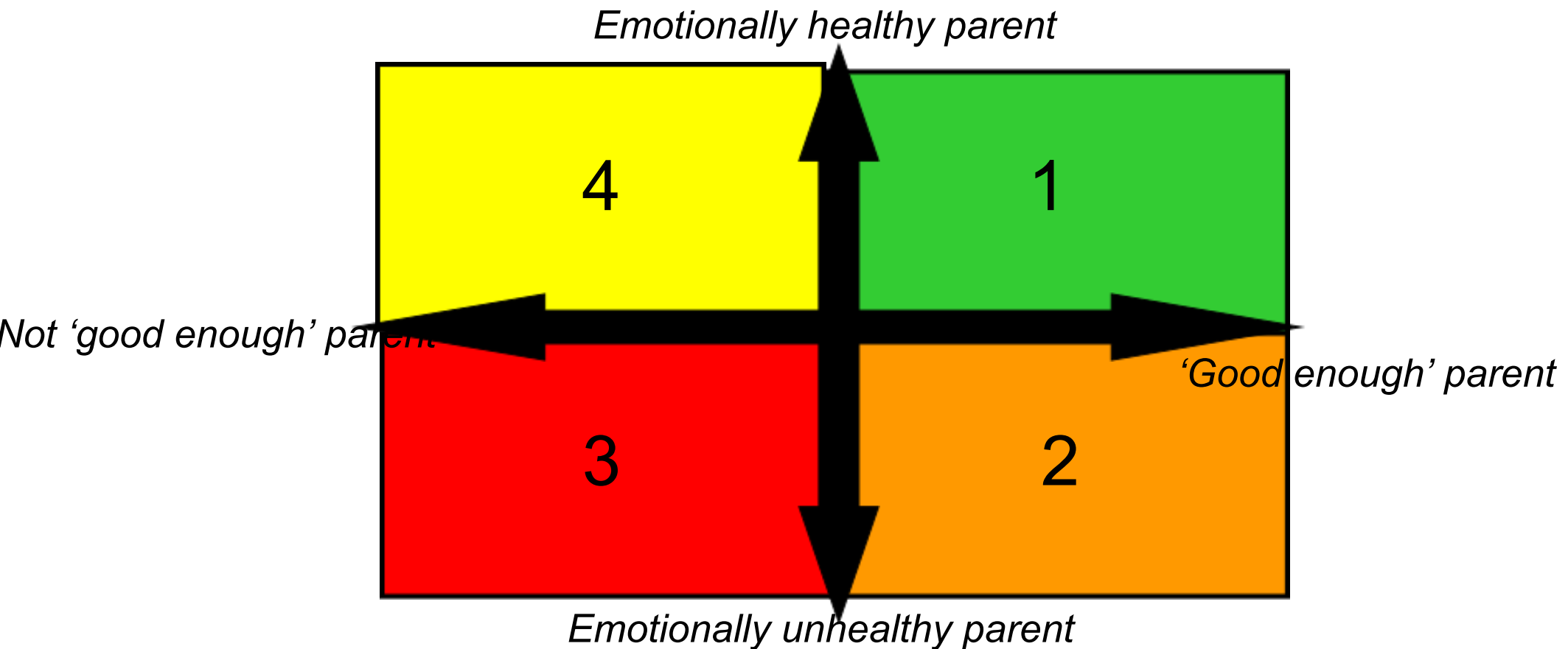

# CPCM: The rationale

- Explicable on a visual analogue (or a snapshot) of baseline parenting functioning
- Motivates parent to plot their own clinical progress
- Clinician can judge the effectiveness of intervention and shifts from the baseline

# Overview

- CPCM is a clinically derived and clinically driven measurement tool
- It is a dynamic relational model
- Applicable to clinical and non-clinical populations
- In depth analysis of caregiver's capacities
- Semi-structured clinical interview with caregiver and observation of parent-child play



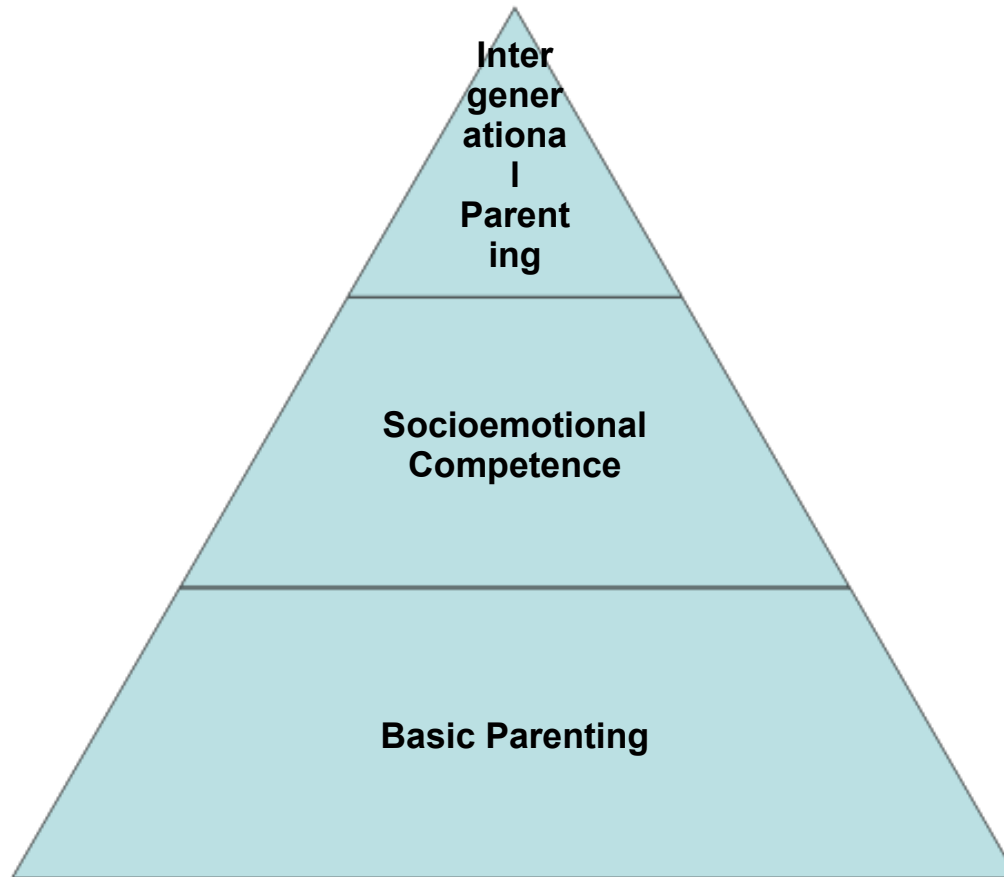
# Format of the semi-structured interview

- Introductory comments
- Team of two members
- Typically two interviews
- Common errors
- Scientific and ethical considerations
- Closing comments

# Dimension I: Basic parenting Items

- Nutrition and Clothing
- Safety Needs
- Stability of Environment
- Co-parenting
- Social Networks

# Dimension II: Socioemotional Competence Items

- Intuitive Parenting
- Attachment Security
- Emotional Warmth
- Maternal Sensitivity
- Care giving Patterns
- Intrusiveness
- Caregivers as social partners

# Dimension III: Intergenerational Parenting Items

- Early Positive Nurturing
- Unresolved trauma
- Reflective Parenting

# Scoring of the CPCM

Final score can be divided into four groups:

- *no risk or very low risk*: well functioning
- *low risk*: minor issues, but relatively well functioning
- *moderate risk*: still struggling and showing some difficulties in parenting
- *high risk*: several concerns in parenting capacity requiring intervention
